Travel Directions to Ocean County College:

MAIN CAMPUS, COLLEGE DRIVE, TOMS RIVER

From The North Or South: Use exit 82 on the Garden State Parkway. Proceed east on Route 37 toward Toms River/Seaside Heights. Go approximately 1 mile (2 traffic lights). Turn at jughandle to Route 549 north (Hooper Avenue). Proceed 3 miles to jughandle leading to Ocean County College campus (College Drive) in Toms River.

Access Road from the West: From Route 9 north or south, take Church Road east. Proceed approximately 1-1/2 miles to access road (H. George Buckwald Dr.) intersection. The road ends at College Drive near Lot 2.

From the West: Use Route 70 west to Lakehurst; take Route 37 east to Toms River/Seaside Heights. Turn at jughandle to Route 549 north (Hooper Avenue). Proceed 3 miles to jughandle leading to Ocean County College campus (College Drive) in Toms River.

CANCELLATION POLICY
