










FIRST TIME (New) & STOP OUT (Readmit)



WHITE & LATINO ETHNICITY




Percentage of OCC Student Headcount Fall 2020 - Fall 2024

Fall 2019 Cohort - Fall 2023 Cohort



Headcounts, Credit Hours, and FTEs - FY2019 - FY2023






OCC Projected Hispanic Population vs Ocean County's Projected Hispanic Population – 2014-2028





OCC Hispanic Student Trends with OCC Projected Hispanic Population and Ocean County's Projected Hispanic Population





"3 Topics That Were on Everyone's Minds at the SHEEO Conference," Inside Higher Education, August 9, 2024

"But conference attendees generally agreed that the hard work—in workforce development, legislative negotiations, tough conversations about financial sustainability and more—will be worth it....

I don't think it's realistic to hope that we look back at this time period and say that was a grand time for higher ed," [Nathan] Grawe, of Carlton [College], said. "But what if instead we look back and say we've expanded access, made policy changes to support students better, made clear connections between academe and life after college ... If we did, I think we would look back and say it might not have been an easy time, but it was quite rewarding."

CHANCES

"But what made getting into college particularly significant for me was not just the opportunities a degree afforded, but also the sense that I was there because someone had taken the time to meet me, to listen and to ultimately believe I had potential. When Mr. Spencer sat in the admissions office of North Central College and said, "I'm going to take a chance on you, Rachel Snyder," those were probably the most important words of my life. The language matters. He wasn't just giving me a chance; he was also staking himself on my fulfilling whatever promise he must have seen in me.
